How To Use These

Dead simple: type the code, then paste or upload whatever you're studying, and hit enter. For example: **/mindmapimage** [paste your biology chapter], or **/quizgame** [paste your history notes]. That's the whole trick.

The **image codes** draw you an actual picture (notes, diagrams, comics, memory scenes). The **interactive codes** build a clickable game or study app right there in the chat. The rest turn your material into guides, practice tests, and clean explanations.

TIP

Stack them for a killer study session: **/lecturenotes** to clean up the mess, **/mindmapimage** to see the whole topic at once, **/flashcards** to drill it, then **/exame** to test yourself. See it, play it, prove it, that's how it actually sticks.
